Thom Koch – Vernon Hills

- 30 years as a full-time middle school teacher, seven years as a substitute teacher at Hawthorn District 73, and 35 years coaching volleyball; nominated for a Golden Apple Award.
 Served 31 years on the Village Board of Vernon Hills and three years on the Zoning Board of Appeals.
- Over 30 years with the Kirk Players of Mundelein in community theatre.
- Advisory board member for the Southlake Campus of the College of Lake County.

Principal Maytee Diez - Waukegan




Tierra Lemon – Waukegan


